REGISTRAR'S CHOICE FOR NOVEMBER



At the completion of the club auction Colin Jennings announced the **Registrar's Choice and Orchid of Open Division** which was an excellent specimen plant of *Cymbidium* Sweet Devon'1103' grown by Graeme and Maureen Hazledine. Colin jokingly commented on the huge flower count and said that he did not have time to do it. Graeme and Maureen declined to offer a number. This impressive plant displayed the characteristics of *Cym. devonianum* hybrids, masses of flowers and the dark coloured labellum contrasting with the other flower segments. The heavy pot which held the plant had large rocks in its base to provide stability but made lifting quite an exercise.

The Orchid of First Division was *Macleanara (McIna.)* Leopard x *Odontocidium (Ocdm.)* Tiger Hambuhren grown by Clyde and Cynthia Dally. This orchid with a single inflorescence over a metre long showed the lovely yellow flowers with the brown barring which is consistent with this type of breeding. Excellent culture had resulted in extra large pseudobulbs which were probably as big and as plump as one could expect. The plant was growing in bark, perlite and some coco peat.

The Orchid of Second Division was *Oncidium* Sharry Baby 'Sweet Fragrance' grown by Trevor and Gwen Camac. The single inflorescence displayed about 90 flowers with the typical dark colouration we see often. This well grown plant was growing in bark with some marble chips and appeared to be producing more inflorescences. Colin suggested that we might see the plant again in February since it is not uncommon for this hybrid to flower twice in a season.

Congratulations to the above growers and many thanks to all the members who brought plants to the meeting to make a great display.

WHAT CAUGHT THE JUDGES EYE IN NOVEMBER

OPEN DIVISION:	Judge	Iris Davies
PLANT NAME:	<i>Glossodia major</i> & <i>Caladenia tentaculata</i>	
GROWER:	Nesbitts Orchids	
COMMENTS:	What a pleasure it was to see so many flowers in each pot of the Australian Native Terrestrial species <i>Calda. tentaculata</i> <i>Gloss. major</i> .	

Both of these pots were grown by Les under 50% shadecloth up in the hills; this being the reason why the later flowering than usual.





The specimen sized pot of *Gloss. major* had 16-18 purple starry flowers on tall stems and had a sweet strong perfume.

The *Calda. tentaculata* specimen sized pot had 20-22 spidery blooms also on tall stems; these were a light green in colour with a brown stripe down the centre of each sepal and a near black lip.

It is lovely to see a good group of each of these stunning "Aussie" natives instead of the usual one or two in a pot.

Thank you Les for two really eye catching pots of blooms.

SECOND DIVISION: Judge Richard Fishlock

GROWER: Rosemary Phillips

PLANT NAME: *Sarco.* (Fitzhart x Lorraine's Red)

COMMENTS: After a very successful Socializing with "Sarcs" evening where a lot of information was shared about this genus, I thought it was most appropriate to describe one of this group. The particular orchid that caught my eye was a plant of *Sarco.* (Fitzhart x Lorraine's Red) which was very well grown and extremely well presented.

There were three racemes with pristine white flowers of good shape. Another pleasing feature was the red colouring in the centre of the flower with the name of 'Lorraine' showing on the label my thoughts went to Lorraine Fagg who was responsible for the breeding with red colouring in many of the hybrids. The small plant of excellent condition was growing in a 100mm pot with mainly small bark and marble chips.

Congratulations Rosemary on your culture and for bringing you plant in for us all to admire.



FIRST DIVISION: Judge Graham Zerbe

PLANT NAME: 2 x *Sarco.* (Flirt x Hot Ice) 'Red Velvet' & 'Freckles'

GROWER: Pauline & Mark Hockey

COMMENTS: What caught my eye as I entered the show bench area was quite a large group of *Sarcochilus* on the end of the First Division Bench, in particular the two pots of the crossing *Sarco.* (Flirt x Hot Ice) each so vastly different; yet each with an eye catching beauty in their own right. The Clone *Sarco.* (Flirt x Hot Ice) 'Red Velvet' was almost solid in colour and the Clone *Sarco.* (Flirt x Hot Ice) 'Freckles' as the name suggests had many darker spots on the segments.



Sarco. Hot Ice as a complex hybrid is 50% *Sarco. hartmannii* and 50% *Sarco. fitzgeraldii* and *Sarco.* Flirt is 75% *Sarco. hartmannii* & 25% *Sarco hirticalcar*, obviously the colour is coming through



from the hybridising using complex hybrids as parents.

This was as a theory suggested by our Guest Speaker Neville Roper at our Socialising with "Sarcs" night; to intensify the colour is selective and use hybrids rather than going back to colourful species.

Well done Pauline & Mark you are choosing your seedlings well and are building a colourful collection of quality orchids.



GUEST SPEAKER FOR DECEMBER

Our Guest Speaker for the December meeting really needs no introduction to many of you but for the newer members that may not know Les Nesbitt here is a thumb nail sketch of Les' life in orchids.

CULTURAL OBSERVATIONS FOR DECEMBER & JANUARY



Well we have had a back to normal period where we need to step up our watering and also our repotting with many genera now requiring to be potted on. Unfortunately the flowering season of our *Sarcochilus* was a little later this year with many now in full bloom. Just after flowering of your *Sarcochilus* a spray of Stress-Guard or Envy or similar will assist in reducing de-hydration as the weather heats up. 'Soft Cane' Dendrobiums also are a little later so continue to turn these toward the north every few days to assist in a good flowering.

There are still plenty of Mealy Bugs about so continue spraying the Metho mix or Confidor to control these pests. Unfortunately all these pests seem to multiple and also come into your growing area from surrounding areas; this also includes scale and red spider that continue to invade our orchids.

Don't forget to put some olive oil or cooking oil on top of your rain-water in your tank(s) to kill off the larvae (wrigglers) and reduce those pesky mosquitoes that keep you awake at night. You also need to renew you Cockroach baits at this time.

It all seems like doom and gloom with all the different pests that forever attack our collections. Well here is another that has come out for some reason in plague proportions and is not only chewing everything in sight but also invading your home.



This pest is known as the 'Black Portuguese Millipede'. It is native to Portugal and was accidentally introduced into Australia and first appeared in SA in 1953 and has expanded from here in Adelaide to across all the southern parts of Australia. They are attracted by light and will enter your house at night but do not breed inside and will die within a few hours although in the meantime they contaminate food, carpets and bedding and if disturbed secrete a foul smelling yellow liquid.

These millipedes are herbivorous and chew orchids. If there are enough of them they can destroy small seedlings including garden vegetables and new leaves on all garden plants. When disturbed they release a pungent distasteful yellow substance which deters birds from eating them. With the introduction of mulch into gardens this created a great haven for them and others to hide and breed. They are usually between 20-45mm long and can be greyish to black in colour. They hatch from eggs in the soil and mature in 2 years. In hot dry weather they will hide in the soil, however rain in the spring and autumn stimulates activity.

To control these you need to reduce external lighting at night so they are not attracted to your house. Placing weather strips on the bottom of external doors will stop them entering the house. Although some predators like spiders and beetles will eat them there are no known predators that will reduce their numbers.





Chemical residual barriers can be sprayed around the house; growing areas and garden these are available from most Supermarket & Nursery outlets. There are other Insecticides such as Ficam and others.

Read the label in the Nursery. If it repels cockroaches, spiders, silverfish etc. it is also great for this pest.

Most of the Australian Natives have now finished flowering and some will soon require re-potting.

Your usual fertilizing regime still needs to be administered and watering days stepped up as the weather heats up.

HOW THE BEST WERE GROWN IN NOVEMBER

OPEN DIVISION:

Graham & Maureen Hazledine have produced another stunning orchid to receive plant of Open Division. The plant *Cymbidium Sweet Devon '1103'* which is a cool growing primary hybrid with the parents of *Cym. (suave x devonianum)*. This plant is watered as needed during autumn, winter and spring. Changing to daily overhead watering in the summer season and when the temperature is over 30°C the plant is watered twice a day.

A mixture of small to medium pine bark, marble chips and styrene foam chips is used as the potting medium. Fertilizing is by the way of 9 month Osmocote Plus and Seamungus.

Maureen tells me that the plant grows under 50% shadecloth hanging up and from January to June has it's diet supplemented with liquid feed of low nitrogen once a week.



FIRST DIVISION:

Clyde & Cynthia Dally grew the best plant in First Division, *Mclna. Leopard x Odcdm. Tiger Hambuhren* a cool growing hybrid. It is watered twice a week in summer and once every two weeks in winter depending on the weather.

The plant is fed with Seasol every month and Focus Growth & Bloom weekly in the growing season.

The potting medium is made up of a mixture of coconut chips, small bark & perlite. Clyde mentions that the plant grows well in shade house conditions.

Well done Clyde & Cynthia another quality plant from you stable



SECOND DIVISION:

Trevor & Gwen Camac were the proud owners of the plant of Second Division.

It was a well grown plant of *Onc. Sharry Baby 'Sweet Fragrance'*.



This hybrid is cool growing and is watered normally weekly with rain water and is fertilized using slow release Osmocote Plus & monthly with a mixture iron chelates and Epsom salts.

The potting medium is a mixture comprising medium pine bark, marble chips and foam beads.

Trevor makes mention that the plant is grown in a semi enclosed shade house with plenty of ventilation, with an evaporative cooler as required on warmer days over the summer months to maintain a higher level of humidity.

Thanks Trevor & Gwen for sharing your plant with us.

Then he gave a more detailed and in depth presentation talking about what he considers when hybridising, about the recessive red genes that are present in the “poached egg” style of hybrids coming through. Neville also told us of his retirement plans to move down south of Sydney and set up things down there.

All in all I thought a very successful evening; I would say that every one would have enjoyed themselves and got a few little treasures added to their collections. The food was great; the presentations were great and informative. The raffle although there are only a few winners, was a complete success financially.
